Social Work

The Social Work Program at Algoma University invites applications for a tenure-track/tenured faculty appointment at the rank of Associate Professor, beginning July 1, 2014. The successful candidate will assume the role of Director of the Social Work program for the first three years of their appointment with the possibility of renewal. A completed PhD in social work or a related discipline is required and the candidate must also hold one degree in social work. The candidate will also have demonstrated commitment to research and undergraduate teaching, and possess teaching and research expertise in several of the following primary areas: health and mental health, homelessness/housing, immigration, international social work, law, criminal justice, and clinical practice with individuals and families with a preference for youth and children. The successful candidate must have completed a PhD (or equivalent experience), a demonstrated commitment to research and undergraduate teaching, and possess teaching expertise in several of the following primary areas: community economic development and/or social economy, community based research, Indigenous/First Nation development, sustainable development. Secondary backgrounds in any of the following are an advantage: anti-oppressive community development practice, social justice and advocacy, and globalization.

The Department of History and Philosophy at Algoma University invites applications for a 9-month contract-limited appointment at the junior-level of Assistant Professor, beginning August 1, 2014. The successful candidate must have completed a PhD. or be A.B.D. in a relevant field, and have a demonstrated commitment to undergraduate teaching. The successful candidate will be expected to teach first-year survey courses in the History of Western Civilization from the Renaissance to the present, a course on Film & Modern History, and two senior seminars, on the Scientific Enlightenment and on the Political Enlightenment.

The successful candidate must have completed a PhD, show a demonstrated commitment to culture-based undergraduate teaching, and possess teaching and research expertise in several of the following primary areas: Anishinaabe education, philosophy, sociology, law, politics, research methodologies. Fluency in an Indigenous language (particularly any variety of Anishinaabemowin) and familiarity with cultural protocols are assets. Applicants will also have a history of success in culture-based education and ethical engagement from within, or in respectful collaboration with, Anishinaabe communities, organizations, and/or institutions. Political Science

The Department of Law and Politics at Algoma University invites applications for a tenure track appointment at the junior-level of Assistant Professor, beginning July 1, 2014. The successful candidate should have completed a PhD (or equivalent), a demonstrated commitment to research and undergraduate teaching, and possess teaching and research expertise in two primary areas: 1) History of Political Thought, and Contemporary Political Theory; 2) Canadian Government, Political Economy and Public Policy. A secondary background in Aboriginal Politics would be useful. Demonstrated ability to develop an independent research program and secure external research funding is an asset.

Geography and Environmental Science

Algoma University in Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario invites applications for a tenure track appointment at the entry level, beginning July 1, 2014. The successful candidate must have completed a PhD (or imminent completion) in Geography, demonstrate a commitment to research and undergraduate teaching, and possess teaching expertise in several of the following: Northern/Arctic Environments, Development of Environmental Thought, Environmental Modelling, Introduction to Resources and Environmental Management, Watershed Hydrology/Watershed Geomorphology, Field Methods, and a World Region (such as Latin America and the Caribbean). The ability to develop an independent research program and the potential to secure external research funding is an asset.

Candidates should submit electronically: a letter of application, a CV, a research plan (up to two pages), a statement of teaching philosophy, and reprints of their three most significant

publications to Dr. Arthur Perlini, Academic Dean, via deanapps@algonau.ca. Application materials should be submitted as a single combined PDF file with the file name identifying the applicant. Applicants must also arrange for three letters of reference to be sent electronically. Applications will be accepted until March 21st, 2014, or until the position is filled. The position is subject to budgetary approval.

The position is open to all qualified applicants, although preference will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada.
