Assistant Professor Position in the UBC Department of Geography

The Department of Geography at UBC invites applications for one tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor in Human Geography. The Department seeks a dynamic scholar with broad intellectual interests who is committed to research and teaching using critical methodologies and pedagogies. This appointment will contribute to teaching in the Department's Environment and Sustainability Program. Any specialty in human geography will be considered, but successful candidates should complement existing Departmental strengths. We particularly encourage scholars of Indigeneity, racialization, and colonization. The successful candidate will be expected to maintain an active program of research, graduate and undergraduate teaching, and to participate fully in graduate supervision, departmental service, events, and initiatives.

The anticipated start date for this position is July 1, 2015 or January 1, 2016. The closing date for applications is **December 19th, 2014**.

Applicants should have a Ph.D. (or solid indication of imminent completion) in geography or a related field. Applicants must apply through the UBC faculty careers website, <http://facultycareers.ubc.ca/19778>. They must upload (in the following order): a cover letter or letter of application; a curriculum vitae that lists the names and contact information of three referees; a publication sample; and evidence of teaching effectiveness. Only completed applications will be considered by the search committee.
