#### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING A PAPER:**

- 1. All authors are asked to submit an abstract via email to the session organizer by 31 January 2015. Abstracts must be sufficiently detailed to allow the session organizer to judge the merits of the paper.
- 2. This year the CPS meeting will be held in conjunction with the Federation of Canadian Demographers meeting, to be held on June 4-5. As such, our program will be shorter this year. We will also introduce a competitive process for paper selection, as there will only be room for four papers per session. Please indicate in your submission if you are willing to be considered for a poster session, and we plan to hold a reception for authors to showcase their research in a poster session.
- 3. The author making the submission should provide the full names, affiliations, addresses, and e-mail addresses of all co-authors for each submission.
- 4. Authors will be notified by session organizers about acceptance of papers beginning on March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
- 5. Completed papers should be sent to session organizers by 15 May 2014.
- 6. Student authors who wish to submit their paper for the Student Paper Competition should submit their abstract to both the session organizer and Zoua Vang (<a href="mailto:zoua.vang@mcgill.ca">zoua.vang@mcgill.ca</a>).
- 7. Students can submit their papers to any session. Those who submitted their papers to the Student Session will receive comments on their papers.
- 8. Authors who wish to submit their papers for consideration only for a poster session should submit their abstract directly to the Organizing Committee Chair, Michael Haan (mhaan@unb.ca).
- 9. If no session is appropriate for your paper, please submit the abstract directly to the Organizing Committee Chair, Michael Haan (mhaan@unb.ca).
- 10. All participants must be current members of the Canadian Population Society to participate in the CPS meeting.
