



Canadian Population Society - Graduate Research Development Conference

CALL FOR PAPERS

June 2nd, 2015 – University of Ottawa, Ottawa, Ontario

The *Canadian Population Society (CPS)* is pleased to announce the 2015 CPS Graduate Research Development Conference. This conference provides graduate students with the unique opportunity to showcase and develop their research related to the quantitative and qualitative characteristics of human population in an accessible workshop format.

Conference Program: Selected participants will be given 15 minutes to present their research and works-in-progress to an audience of students and researchers drawn from the *CPS* community. This is followed by 15-minutes of time for the research “trainer” assigned to each participant, to provide individualized feedback on presentation-style and substantive issues in the student’s research and for the audience to ask questions. Every effort will be made to match the expertise of trainers with the substantive focus of the research.

Submissions and Selection: Submit an abstract or completed paper to Scott Mandich (smandich@uwo.ca) by **February 27th, 2015**. Full papers will be required by April 15th. The selection committee will select participants based on the quality of the paper and its relevance to the quantitative and qualitative characteristics of human population. Students are encouraged to seek out funding sources from their home universities and elsewhere to help cover the cost of attending and presenting at the conference.

Participant Eligibility: Participation is open to graduate students who are current or new members of the *Canadian Population Society* (For information on membership, visit: <http://www.canpopsoc.ca/>). Students must be the sole or principal author of a paper related to the quantitative and qualitative characteristics of human population change. Students remain eligible and are encouraged to present, either the same paper or a different one, at the regular CPS sessions and other meetings associated with Congress 2015.
