INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING A PAPER:

1. ***Abstract submission deadline:*** Authors are asked to submit **an abstract** via email to the Program Chair, Lisa Kaida (kaidar@mcmaster.ca) **by 11:59pm PT, January 15, 2023.** Abstracts must be sufficiently detailed to allow us to judge the merits of the paper (recommended length: no more than 500 words).

2. ***“Black/Indigenous communities” session theme:*** In alignment with the Congress 2023 theme “Reckonings and Re-imaginings” honouring Black and Indigenous knowledge and cultures, the CPS introduces a new session theme on “Black/ Indigenous communities” (see the above session theme list).
 3. ***Annual meeting format:*** The 2023 CPS annual meeting is hybrid; while in-person presenters and attendees meet at York University, remote participation as a paper presenter, a poster presenter, or an attendee is also possible. However, we highly encourage you to participate in person at the 2023 CPS annual meeting and the Congress 2023 to take full advantage of in-person social events such as the CPS reception (May 31), CPS graduate student professional development event (TBA), CPS banquet (June 1), and Congress President’s Reception for CPS (June 1).

4. **Required information:** The author making the submission should provide: **1) the full names, 2) affiliations; 3) e-mail addresses of all co-authors for each submission; 4) two preferred session themes** (see the 2023 session themes in Item #1); **5) the presenter's name; and 6) the presenter's preferred format of presentation (in person or remotely).** The author who makes the submission will be treated as the corresponding author unless otherwise noted.
5. **Student participation:** The CPS encourages student members to participate. **If you are a student member and submitting an abstract for a session, please indicate your degree program** (e.g. Master's student in Demography, Sociology, etc.) along with your affiliation. Such information will help facilitate student participation and identify those eligible for the student paper competition and the Congress Graduate Merit Award.

The CPS is also organizing an in-person social event for students' career development during the annual meeting. We will be sending out more information about this event in the coming months.

6. **The Student Paper Competition:** Students' abstracts that are accepted for presentation in the CPS annual meeting, either in a session or as a poster, are eligible for the Student Paper Competition. Students will be notified about the eligibility to submit a paper to the Student Paper Competition. The committee is co-chaired by Eugena Kwon (eugenakwon@trentu.ca) and Michelle Maroto (maroto@ualberta.ca).

The deadline to submit a paper to the Student Paper Competition Committee Co-chairs (Drs. Kwon and Maroto) is April 30, 2023.

7. **Announcement of results:** We will notify corresponding authors about **acceptance of papers beginning on February 15, 2023.** Session chairs also will be announced in March 2023.
8. **Poster session:** We endeavour to create sessions that are thematically cohesive to encourage exchange and engagement between presenters as well as with the audience. We often receive excellent research that does not fit within a given session, and in these cases, we invite the presenters to join a poster session. An in-person poster session/ reception will take place on May 31, 2023 (Day 1 of the annual meeting) at York University. We also plan on holding a virtual poster session for remote poster presenters/ attendees.
9. **Membership requirement:** All participants must be current members of the Canadian Population Society to participate in the CPS annual meeting. Please make note that at least one author of an accepted paper must **register for the Congress and the CPS annual meeting by April 15, 2023 (Congress fee early-bird deadline: March 31, 2023).** Papers for which no author has registered by this deadline will be dropped from the final program.
10. **Submission of the final paper:** Completed papers should be sent to session chairs (TBA) by **May 20, 2023.**
