Once every five years, the [Census of Population](#) provides a detailed and comprehensive statistical portrait of Canada. The 2021 Census data have arrived. Starting in February 2022, there will be seven major releases over the course of the year. Each release will provide data, analytical, and reference products. Read [The Daily](#) for announcements about future Census releases. Also available are the [Guide to the Census of Population, 2021](#) and [reference guides](#) to census concepts.

To help users better understand the Census of Population, Statistics Canada has produced a series of

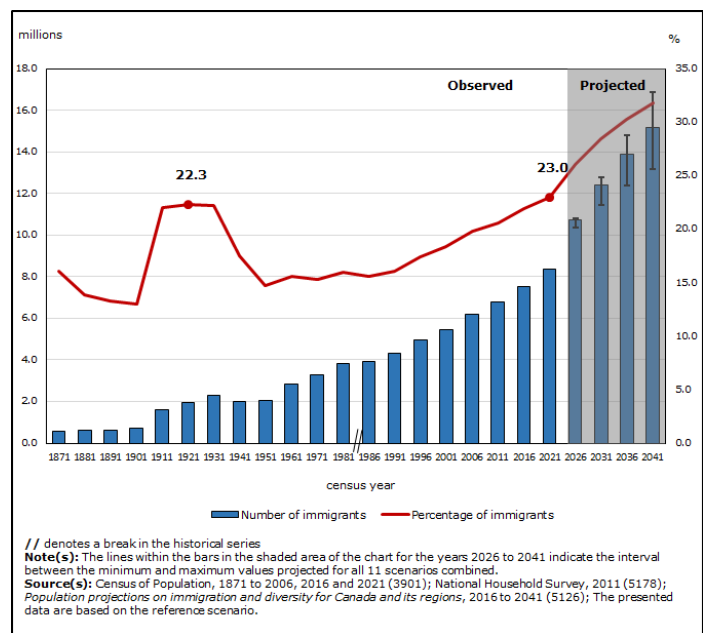

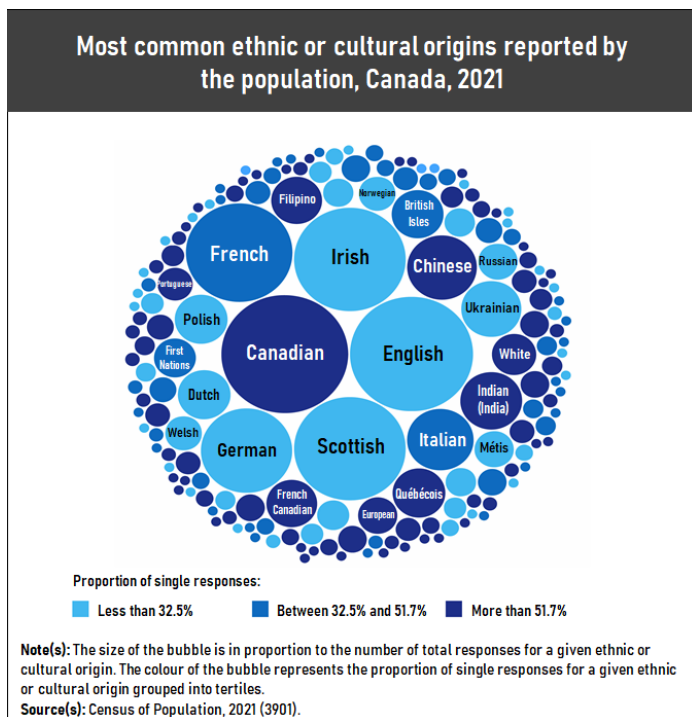
