**INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING A PAPER:**

1. **Abstract submission deadline:** Authors are asked to submit **an abstract** via email to the session organizer **by January 31, 2020**. Abstracts must be sufficiently detailed to allow the session organizer to judge the merits of the paper.
2. **Required information:** The author making the submission should provide: **1) the full names, 2) affiliations, and 3) e-mail addresses of all co-authors for each submission**. The author who makes the submission will be treated as the corresponding author unless otherwise noted.
3. **Students' participation:** The CPS encourages student members to participate. **If you are a student member and submitting an abstract for a session, please indicate your degree program** (e.g. Master's student in Sociology, etc.) along with your affiliation. Such information will help facilitate student participation and identify those eligible for the student paper competition.

The CPS is also organizing various events for students' career development. We will be sending out more information about this in the coming months.

4. **"Sex, Gender, and Sexuality" and "Indigenous Demographics" themes:** The CPS recognizes the importance of advancing research in themes of gender and indigenous demographics, which were introduced in the CPS 2019 conference. These sessions are included in the Call for Papers for the CPS 2020 conference.

5. **Special session in CPS 2020:** CPS 2020 will feature a special session on “Canadian Research Data Centres (RDCs): Realizing the Potential of Administrative Linkages”. A brief description is offered in the list of sessions below.
6. **Abstract submission for the Poster session:** Authors who wish to submit their papers only for a poster session should submit their abstract directly to the Organizing Committee Chair, Yoko Yoshida ([yoko.yoshida@dal.ca](mailto:yoko.yoshida@dal.ca)).
7. **Abstract submission for no specific sessions:** If no session is appropriate for your paper, please submit the abstract directly to the Organizing Committee Chair, Yoko Yoshida ([yoko.yoshida@dal.ca](mailto:yoko.yoshida@dal.ca)).
8. **The Student Paper Competition:**
  - Students’ abstracts that are accepted for presentation in the CPS conference, either in a session or as a poster, are eligible for the Student Paper Competition. Students will be notified about the eligibility to submit a paper to the Student Paper Competition. The committee is chaired by Martin Cooke [cooke@uwaterloo.ca](mailto:cooke@uwaterloo.ca) and Stacey Hallman [stacey.hallman@canada.ca](mailto:stacey.hallman@canada.ca).
  - The deadline to submit a paper to the Student Competition Committee Co-chairs is April 30, 2020.

9. **Announcement of results:** Session organizers will notify corresponding authors about acceptance of papers beginning on **February 28, 2020**.
10. **Submission of the final paper:** Completed papers should be sent to session organizers by **May 15, 2020**.
11. **Membership requirement:** All participants must be current members of the Canadian Population Society to participate in the CPS meeting. Please make note that at least one author of an accepted paper must **register for the conference by April 17, 2020**. Papers for which no author has registered by this deadline will be dropped from the final program.

The availability of the Master Files of Statistics Canada micro-data through RDCs has provided Canadian researchers with a great tool and rich resources to address new research questions. Papers in this session will take advantage of administrative records or integrated data (surveys linked to administrative records) available in the RDCs to reveal new insights about Canadian society. Examples include linkages to the TIFF or the IMDB, the Canadian Cancer Registry, or the Vital Stats - Death database.
