

CALL FOR PAPERS (November 15, 2023 updated)

Canadian Population Society 2024 Annual Meeting (hybrid conference)

June 18–20, 2024, McGill University, Montréal, QC

Deadline for Submission: February 2, 2024

Please join us in celebrating the CPS 50th anniversary! The 2024 CPS annual meeting will be full of events. Day 1 (June 18) will be dedicated to the 50th anniversary sessions, followed by a wine reception/poster session at the McGill University Faculty Club. On the afternoon of Day 3 (June 20), we will hold joint bilingual sessions on immigration with Association des démographes du Québec (ADQ) at Centre Urbanisation Culture Société de l'INRS, with a reception with ADQ in the evening.

Before submitting an abstract, please note a few important things:

Since Day 1 of the meeting is dedicated to invitation-only anniversary sessions, we may not be able to accept all the submissions to a regular session or a poster session.

Due to limited technical support for hybrid sessions from the Federation, priority will be given to presenters who are able to present in person.

All participants in the 2024 CPS annual meeting must register for the Congress and CPS annual meeting on the Congress website. Since CPS members can receive a discounted rate for annual meeting registration, we recommend all participants to join the CPS before registration.

Please note that a presenting author of an accepted paper must register for the Congress and the CPS annual meeting by May 1 (Congress fee early-bird deadline: March 31). Papers for which no author has registered by this deadline will be dropped from the final program.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING A PAPER

Abstract submission deadline: Authors are asked to submit an abstract to the online submission page (https://forms.office.com/r/XywinVE8Un) by 11:59 pm PST, February 2 (Fri). Abstracts must be sufficiently detailed to allow us to judge the merits of the paper (recommended length: no more than 500 words).

Required information: The authors making the online submission are asked to provide: 1) the full names/affiliations/ e-mail addresses of all co-authors; 2) two preferred session themes (see the 2024 session themes below); 3) the presenter's name; and 4) the presenter's availability to present in person. The author who makes the submission will be treated as the corresponding author unless otherwise noted.

CPS 2024 session themes are as follows. Abstracts pertaining to #4: Immigration and migration maybe considered for ADQ-CPS joint bilingual sessions on immigration, which will be held on the afternoon of June 20 at INRS.

- 2. Morbidity and health
- 3. Family
- 4. Immigration and migration
- 5. Social diversity
- 6. Labour market and education
- 7. Fertility
- 8. Gender and sexuality
- 9. Other topics

Announcement of results: We will notify corresponding authors about the acceptance of abstracts beginning on March 1. Session chairs will be announced in April 2024.

Annual meeting format: The 2024 CPS annual meeting is hybrid; while in-person presenters and attendees meet at McGill University, remote participation as a paper presenter or an attendee is also possible. However, we highly encourage you to participate in person in the 2024 CPS annual meeting and Congress 2024 to take full advantage of in-person social events such as the CPS wine reception/ poster session (June18), CPS graduate student professional development event (June 18), CPS banquet (June 19), and Congress President's Reception for CPS (TBA), ADQ-CPS joint sessions on immigration (June 20), and ADQ-CPS joint reception (June 20).

Student participation: We encourage student members to participate. If you are a student member and submitting an abstract for a session, please indicate your degree program (e.g. PhD student in Sociology) along with your affiliation. Such information will help

facilitate student participation and identify those eligible for the student paper competition and the Congress Graduate Merit Award. CPS Student Representatives (Michaela Bunakova and Yue Teng) also are organizing an in-person event on June 18 (Day1).

Student paper competition: Students' abstracts that are accepted for presentation in the CPS annual meeting, either in a session or as a poster, are eligible for the Student Paper Competition. Students will be notified about the eligibility to submit a paper to the Student Paper Competition. The committee is chaired by Michelle Maroto. Poster session: We endeavour to create sessions that are thematically cohesive to encourage exchange and engagement between presenters as well as with the audience. We often receive excellent research that does not fit within a given session, and, in these cases, we invite the presenters to join a poster session. The in-person poster session will take place on June 18 (Day 1) at the McGill University Faculty Club.

Submission of the full paper: Completed papers should be sent to session chairs (TBA) by May 31.
